COURSE IMPROVEMENTS THROUGH OCTOBER

I hope this newsletter reaches you in good health and spirits! Happy fall, it's hard to believe that October is here! I was always told that time goes by faster as you get older, and I am starting to believe it's true.

The golf course is in great shape heading into October! September was a busy month for golf course maintenance and projects. We did get the cart paths resurfaced on holes 12, 13, 14 and the bridge on hole 15 last month. Fairways were fertilized last month, and we slit seeded 10 holes to increase the bent grass in some fairway areas. We also aerified all the greens and tees in late September. We plan to aerify the fairways next week and sod some areas in the fairways. All these projects will continue to improve the turf quality for you to enjoy!

As we begin to transition into the fall, please remember this is some of the best golf weather to enjoy. Some of the best fall scenic views can be seen right here at Twin Lakes. I greatly appreciate your continued support of your club and I look forward to seeing you out enjoying your club!

LEAF REMOVAL STARTS; ASK ABOUT THE "LEAF RULE"

The aerification of greens and tees last week went very well, and both are healing quite well with the warmer temperatures. The fairways will be next with us completing a few a day, weather permitting.

Weeds have been sprayed in fairways, and the tees and roughs will be next. We have also slit seeded the sprayed areas in the fairways as well.

The huge task of leaf removal is getting started, and for the next four to five weeks we will do our best to keep the course clean. Check with Jim about the fall "leaf rule," and he will explain how that works.

We have a few more projects we intend to finish before winter, and then we'll put the course to bed for the winter.

Come out and play this fall as I think it's truly the best time of the season to play.


